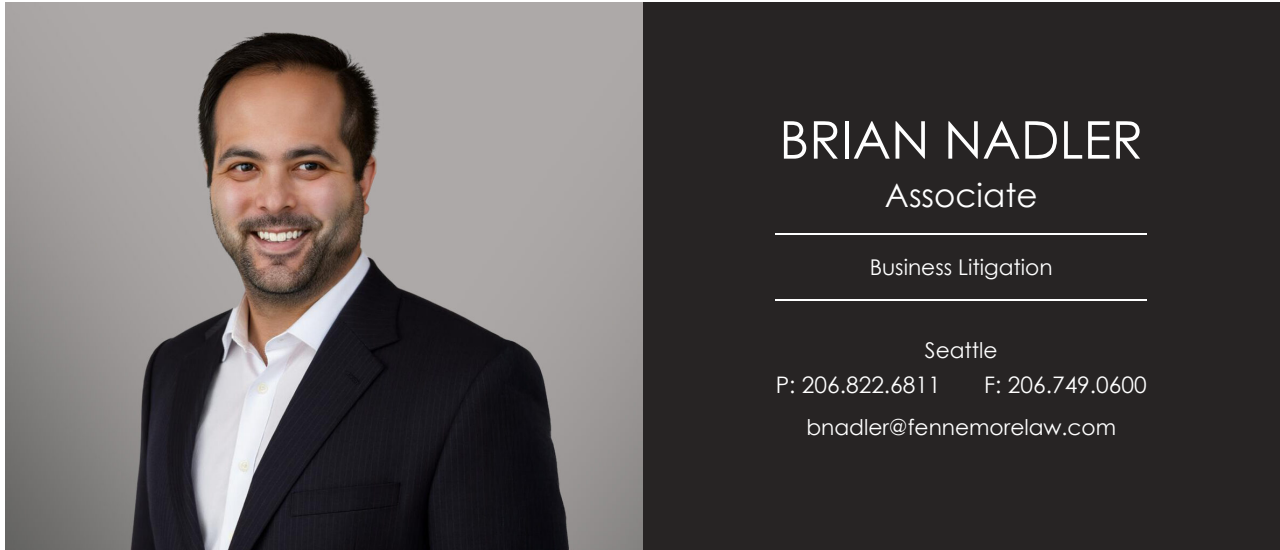




BRIAN NADLER

REPRESENTATIVE MATTERS

Dearinger v. Eli Lilly, 2026 WL 788866 (9th Cir. 2026) (argued): represented appellants as Ninth Circuit appointed pro bono counsel on complex pharmaceutical products liability case involving the trial court's failure to follow procedural and substantive requirements in not requesting appointment of counsel and properly applying the learned intermediary doctrine.

Port of Anacortes v. Frontier Indus., 9 Wn. App. 2d 885, 447 P.3d 215 (Div. 1 2019): drafted briefing successfully defending a challenge to what constitutes a hazardous substance under the Model Toxics Control Act.
